The documents Sámediggi 01/850-51 "Requirements for support of Sami languages in data processing" and
Sámediggi 01/850-86 "Recommendations for Sami PC-type keyboard layouts", issued in November 2002 and
August 2003 respectively, contain information on Sami-language IT needs regarding character repertoires,
coding schemes, keyboard layouts and fonts.

This document contains complementary information regarding writing of dates in the Sami languages, as well
as some additional terms needed for IT implementations.

This document complements Sámediggi 01/850-51 "Requirements for support of Sami languages in IT" and Sámediggi 01/850-86 "Recommendations for Sami PC-type keyboard layouts" with information on Sami-language date-writing conventions, as well as some other language-specific data.

1 Scope

This document specifies the names for days and months in the Northern, Lule, Southern, Inari and Skolt Sami languages, as well as the rules for using those names in the writing of dates. It also contains some other terms needed for implementation of full support for the Sami languages in IT.

The purpose of the document is to serve as an authoritative source of information for the IT industry, and also as a basis for work in formal standardization, primarily in possible future registrations of Sami-language "cultural elements" according to ISO/IEC 15897 (see Bibliography).

The document is therefore a complement to the previously published Sámediggi 01/850-51 *"Requirements for support of Sami languages in IT"* and Sámediggi 01/850-86 *"Recommendations for Sami PC-type keyboard layouts"*.

2 Background

For Sami-language vocabularies and orthographies a number of sources exist, but they are not all completely consistent. Also, their authoritativeness is not always clear. This has been a large problem in the development of support for Sami in IT.

In an inter-Nordic standardisation project started in 1991, the cultural elements of the Nordic languages were specified, and the result was published in the document "Nordic Cultural Requirements on Information Technology" (see Bibliography). Sami was one of the languages included, but only in the Northern Sami variety.

Later, a special committee with participation from the three Nordic Sami Parliaments, "Samisk Datautvalg", developed a procurement specification for Sami-supporting software for Apple Macintosh and Microsoft Windows. The Northern, Lule, Inari and Skolt languages were covered, but not Southern Sami. The specification was issued in 1997 (see Bibliography).

Note: "Macintosh" is a trademark of Apple Computer, Inc. and "Windows" is a trademark of Microsoft Corporation.)

The present document was developed starting early 2003, with previous work as the basis, and in consultation with experts on the respective languages. It has been reviewed by Samisk Språknemnd (the Sami Language Board), which endorsed it in November 2003.

3 National differences

The Sami nation stretches across Norway, Sweden and Finland (and Russia, whose Sami language is however outside the scope of this document). Therefore, in the Sami language area different nationally-standardised formats exist e.g. for the writing of dates in numerical form. Such differences are not dealt with in this document, which applies to languages, not to national states.

Also, dialectal differences exist within the languages across their areas of use, e.g. some weekday names differ geographically. For IT implementation purposes the specifications need to be related to nations, and such differences are therefore given in this specification as Norwegian, Swedish or Finnish. The dialectal areas are however independent of state borders, and dialectal varieties specified as Swedish may apply in Norway and/or Finland, and vice versa.

In Skolt Sami orthography two special characters are needed together with the letters, a "soft sign" and a "consonant-separating sign". In data processing, these are represented by "free-standing acute accent" and "straight apostrophe", respectively (U+00B4 and U+0027 according to ISO/IEC 10646 and Unicode). In the names above the consonant-separating sign is used in skamm´mään / skamm´mannu only, the rest of the special characters being soft signs.

5 Writing of dates in Sami

The conventions for writing "text-form dates", i.e. with day number, month name and year, differ between languages. In ISO registrations according to ISO/IEC 15897 this format is designated "Long date".

In the Sami languages, dates are written in the format *monthname daynumber year* with monthname in genitive and with initial lower-case letter (although normal capitalising rules apply at beginning of sentence etc.). Some minor format differences exist between the languages. Examples:
